# Toronto Catholic District School Board (TCDSB) International Languages Elementary (ILE) – After Hours Program Frequently Asked Ouestions

### 1. What is the ILE After Hours program?

• The ILE after hours program offers language classes to students who want to learn another language in addition to English and French.

### 2. Is English or French offered?

 No. English and French are not offered, as they are Canada's official languages and are part of the day school curriculum.

#### 3. What languages does TCDSB currently offer?

- The languages offered for the 2023-2024 ILE after-hours program are as follows: Arabic, Armenian, Cantonese, Croatian, Filipino, Igbo, Italian, Korean, Mandarin, Polish, Portuguese, Spanish, Tigrinya, and Vietnamese.
- All language classes and locations for 2023-2024 are contingent upon student registration and available staff to teach the classes and/or to supervise the centres.
- All language classes require a minimum of 23 pre-registered students from any division.

# 4. Can a new language be added?

#### 5. Who can enroll in the program?

• Students registered in kindergarten to grade 8 in 2023-2024, in an Ontario public or private school.

## 6. Does the student have to be enrolled in a TCDSB day school to register for the program?

- Although the program is offered by TCDSB, in accordance with the Ministry funding guidelines for this after-hours program, students from other school boards and/or private schools can enroll if they are living in Ontario.
- If the student is enrolled in another Ontario school board, the parent is required to register using the child's Ontario Education Number (OEN).
- If the student attends a private school, or is has a VISA status, an OEN number will be created. However, prior to the creation of an OEN, parents will be asked to submit requested documentation to the ILE Department.

# 7. How many languages can a student enrol in?

- A student could only enrol in one language per week at the same time.
- A student can enroll in another language ONLY if the language is offered at a different time.

# 8. If my child attended the program in 2022-2023, do they have to registered for 2023-2024?

• Yes. Registration is a yearly process.

#### 9. What is the cost to enroll in the program?

- \$20.00 program enhancement fee per student.
- The program enhance fee will only be collected via School Cash Online in late October when the student is physically attending the program.

# 10. What happens if there isn't sufficient enrolment to offer a language class?

- <u>If there is an existing language class</u> at another centre that offers the same language, the student will be reassigned, and the parent will be notified via the email provided during the registration process; or
- <u>If there isn't an existing class</u>, without the required students to open a class, the parent will be notified via the email provided during the registration process.

# 11. When will parents be notified that the student will be reassigned to another centre, or that there isn't sufficient enrolment at the start of classes to begin a class?

• If the student has been reassigned to a different centre from the one that the parent registered in, or there isn't an existing class at another centre, and/or insufficient enrolment to begin a class on September 30<sup>th</sup>, the parent will receive notification via email from the ILE Department's secretary by mid-September.

#### 12. What is the schedule for the classes?

- Classes run for 2.5 hours on Saturdays, for a total of 29 sessions per academic year.
- Students are expected to attend all program sessions.

#### 13. Once the student is assigned to a class, who do parents contact for information?

- Once the student is assigned to a class, the first point of contact is the classroom instructor.
- The parent can also reach out to the centre's instructor-in-charge.

# 14. Does the student receive assessment on the progress in the language class?

• Parents receive two progress reports from their child's instructor.
