In April 2023, our Toronto Catholic learning community experienced a remarkable situation that highlighted the quick thinking of our staff from St. John Bosco Catholic School. During a daily physical activity session, a student fell while running in the schoolyard and the impact of the fall left them visibly distressed and lying motionless on the ground. With immediate, unwavering determination, our Toronto Catholic staff sprang into action. Ms. Vanessa Gentile immediately dialled 911, while Mr. Danny Di Giovine and Mr. Ryan Giza swiftly accessed the situation. They realized the severity of the situation when the student's pulse weakened and breathing became laboured. Following the instructions given by emergency services, they also initiated chest compressions,

providing crucial life-saving measures until the paramedics arrived. Both medical professionals from the Hospital for Sick Children (SickKids) and the paramedics involved have expressed their sincere gratitude and confirmed that the immediate response by our St. John Bosco staff members played a crucial role in saving the student's life. It fills our hearts with immense relief and joy that the student is now in stable condition, having moved out of intensive care and has embarked on a path of recovery. The incredible courage displayed by our St. John Bosco staff members along with their immediate response and commitment to our students' well-being exemplify the utmost dedication we strive for in our Toronto Catholic community. As we reflect on this extraordinary incident, let us recognize the immense strength and courage exhibited by our unwell student, our remarkable staff and the unwavering support of our extended TCDSB community.


Juliana Hibbett, Lunchtime Supervisor, Our Lady of Grace Catholic School
